The Blessed Sacrament (con't)

When we pass before the place where the sacred host is reserved, we should genuflect or make a profound bow.

We should always observe modest dress and decorum that are appropriate to very solemn occasions in the church and especially in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. We should take care that we avoid any actions that might disturb or distract others or draw attention to ourselves rather than Jesus. We can promote Eucharistic adoration first of all by doing it ourselves! Make frequent visits to Jesus the tabernacle. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "Because Christ himself is present in the sacrament of the altar, He is to be honored with the worship of adoration. To visit the Blessed Sacrament is a proof of gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord."

Again we ask that you take the opportunity to attend the scheduled Eucharistic devotions, honoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.
