EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT (cont) ~

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is the placement of the sacred host outside the tabernacle for public adoration. This can take many forms. The simplest form is the opening of the tabernacle doors. Another form is the removal of the sacred vessels from the tabernacle for a more prominent and visible placement. The Church also permits a "full" exposition, when the sacred host is clearly visible in a vessel called a "monstrance". There are three purposes of Eucharistic Exposition: 1) to acknowledge Christ's marvelous presence in the sacrament; 2) to lead us to a fuller participation in the celebration of the Eucharist, culminating in Holy Communion; and 3) to foster the worship which is due to Christ in spirit and truth.

This Saturday, July 26, the first of our three churches will be celebrating Eucharistic Adoration from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at St. Benedict the Moor Church (Centre Ave. & Crawford St.). Remember that Bishop Zubik has asked the faithful of the diocese to pray for vocations to the priesthood, religious, married and single life.

WINDOW RESTORATION ~ The window restoration project continues to progress and we are told the window will be set in place by Christmas. We owe yet \$41,000 to complete the work. Again, we are sincerely grateful for those who have been faithful in donating to the window restoration project.
