**CELEBRATION OF THE YEAR OF ST. PAUL** ~ Last Sunday, at St. Paul Cathedral, Bishop Zubik inaugurated the beginning of the "Year of St. Paul". During this year, Eucharistic Adoration will be scheduled throughout parishes of the diocese. It may be well for all of us to reflect on the meaning of the Eucharist, and so through the next few weeks this bulletin will review and reflect on the sacrament of the Eucharist.

**FOOD FESTIVAL** ~ Because of the transitioning in our parish due to the Envisioning Ministry, along with the foreseeing of much activity with the construction of the new rectory, the Food Festival will be cancelled for this year. This decision came with the consent of the parish councils of both churches. We are in the process of discerning fund raisers during the year. Thank you for your support with this decision.

**THE EUCHARIST** is the sacrament that Jesus established when he took bread and wine, blessed them, and declared them to be his body and blood. (Luke 22:17-20) He commanded his disciples to "Do this in memory of me." Jesus earlier foretold that his presence in the Eucharist would be real and substantial: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever...Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink" When a Catholic priest follows this command of Jesus and offers the words of consecration, the bread and wine are permanently changed, and they become Jesus, body, blood, soul and divinity. The presence of Jesus is abiding, not something that vanishes at the conclusion of Mass. The hosts remaining after Communion are kept in a special place of honor called the **tabernacle**.

**PANHANDLERS** ~ We ask that you do not give money to panhandlers, especially those around our church area before and after Mass. We feed the hungry when they come to our door and no one is ever turned away. We do not make a practice of giving money that may be used for enabling a harmful habit. The money from St. Vincent de Paul and the poor boxes is the money to help in serving the poor. A better use of your money would be to support the poor box ~ that in turn will go to those in need.

**THE TABERNACLE** was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent from the Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist deepened, the Church became more conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord under the Eucharistic species. (to continue)
