Scripture Insights

.In 2 Corinthians, Paul wrote that “in Christ....old things have passed away; behold, new things have come.” The readings today speak of God’s new things throughout salvation history.

In the First Reading the Lord says to Joshua, Moses’ personal assistant who successfully led Israel into the Promised Land: “Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you”. No longer was Israel reliant on manna in the desert for survival. Now the Israelites would eat the produce from the land of Canaan, harvested from the fields of the Promised Land. The reproach of Egypt had been removed because now Israel, for the first time since their captivity and slavery in Egypt centuries earlier, were completely free of Egypt, living independently off the fields of the Promised Land. Something new had come to pass.

In today’s well-know parable of the lost son, the conflict between Jesus and the religious elite of his day, the Pharisees and the scribes, sets the context. They complained that Jesus was sharing table fellowship with tax collectors and sinners. Their objection stemmed from the belief that the Messiah was coming to justify and redeem the law-abiding Jews, not Jews who sinned and were unclean. Jesus surprised and angered the Pharisees and scribes when he made it clear to them that the Messiah was sent to find the sinner and the unclean , the lost sheep, of the House of Israel. The parable of the lost son reinforced that God was doing something new and unprecedented in their history. Through Jesus, God was removing the reproach of the unclean and the sinners.

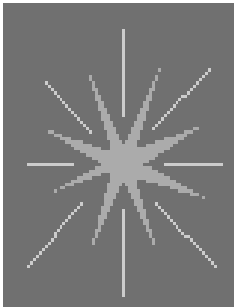
