Bishop Zubik has announced a diocesan-wide year of extended opportunities for exposition and adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament to coincide with the observance of the "Year of Sr. Paul the Apostle". This opportunity was called for by Pope Benedict XVI, commencing June 29, 2008 through June 29, 2009. All parishes, religious communities and educational institutions are asked to celebrate exposition and adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament on two days between these dates. The special focus of this year long endeavor is that the Church in Pittsburgh will continue to grow holy vocations to the ordained ministry, consecrated life, married life, and the single life. Epiphany has been blessed to have the opportunity of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament each day. However, we will have a celebration of two special days in responding to the call of our Holy Father. SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND ~ In last Sunday's bulletin you read that the second collection for this weekend is for Catholic Relief Services ~ Church in Latin America, Church in Central and Eastern Europe, and Church in Africa. Since this announcement, we have learned that the recent cyclone in Myanmar (formerly known as Burma), has created a humanitarian crisis surpassed only by the East Asian tsunamis in 2004. It is estimated that 100,000 people could die without immediate aid. As many as 1 million are now homeless. In the light of this, the Diocese has changed the combined collection scheduled for this weekend. Bishop Zubik has indicated that the diocese will devote 70 percent of the combined collection to **Catholic Relief Services** and provide 10 percent to each of the other three causes. **Catholic Relief Services** will be providing the direct aid in Myanmar. Please be as generous as your means allow. In addition, we ask that you remember the people of Myanmar in your prayers. Thank you for your support.
